There are so many groups that run during the week here at St John's, groups for all ages. One that has probably flown under the radar is our wonderful First Steps baby and toddler group. First Steps is run in the youth centre hall by myself and a small cluster of volunteers. It is a group that is open to the community and it caters to all carers. Our group runs as an open play space to children as young as new-born right up until the age of 3/4. We have an hour of free play with fresh homemade cake (thank you to the lovely ladies who bake each week) and coffee/tea and plenty of snacks for children. Children then have a chance to hear a bible story or go through a bible-based series like "Creation" or "Thank You God for....". We love that we can freely open up God's word and not shy away from biblical truth to a group of young children and their non-Christian carers.

After making a craft, we enjoy a space to dance and sing our favourite nursery rhymes and even get a chance to teach some songs we sing in church! We love when Robin brings in his guitar, tuba or even parachute! The children have a blast! However, what we love most about our group is the connections we can form with the families and children that come through our doors. We can chat and get to know all the carers and therefore hopefully plant a seed in guiding them towards a relationship with the Lord Jesus. It is the biggest form of outreach that St John's runs and I am in awe of the numbers that have grown, up to 28 children, each week! We are busy! Praise God!!

Having said that, it would be wonderful to see more families in our church attend with their little ones. Put yourself in a non-Christian carer's shoes. There's nothing quite like chatting to someone who is in the same boat as you. It would be even better if that someone could help you spark that curiosity in the gospel and living a life for Jesus who promises love and everlasting salvation. So, this is a call to all families in the church with children under the age of 5! Your regular attendance could play a deep impact in the life of a family who does not yet know the Lord.

Also, a plea to anyone who is free to help us run the group and volunteer on our team. God willing, the church could open a second group on a different morning (we are certainly heading that way). Our group is such a chaotically wonderful space and we just love the carers and children who come and be a part of it each week. If you feel a pull to join in as a volunteer, please do come chat to me!
