### Isn't it all just a matter of interpretation?

6<sup>th</sup> July

Engrained in the 21<sup>st</sup> century mindset is the belief you can't know anything for definite. Of course, this isn't true, we know from experience cause and effect, we know actions have consequences. This is true at a personal and a scientific level. Alongside this, we have a moral compass, knowing instinctively right from wrong – even when we choose to ignore it. For example, we know instinctively that harming someone deliberately, is wrong!

The problem is our culture finds many ways to obscure truth and make wrong things feel right, or presents us with obscure examples of how wrong things can appear reasonable, or right things unreasonable. This has the effect of clouding our judgement and makes us doubt right from wrong. Proverbs 14:12 reminds us, "There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death."

The Apostle Paul wrote to the churches in Colosse: "See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the elemental spiritual forces of this world rather than on Christ." Over the centuries, the church has come under attack for its stand on issues of morality and yet it's been able to stand firm with a robust and clear call to God's Word. However, in the past 25 years, what previous centuries have failed to do, our culture has manged. Accomplished through decisive undermining of God's Word, not from the outside, but from within the church itself, achieved by cleverly twisting God's word! We have witnessed this within the Church of England which, through poor leadership, has allowed the vital foundation of faith to be corroded and damaged. The evidence of this can be seen in the way people now argue over teaching we've understood for centuries and yet now believe we can reinterpret in a way no reasonable person would ever have considered credible.

These would be dangerous times but for one unchangeable fact, since God never changes, neither does his revelation to us! God's Word may well be hard to hear, say things we would rather not hear, but this isn't a good reason to reinterpret, rather it's a warning sign that mankind's the problem, not God! Without a gospel, there is nothing to tackle the world's standards and that leads to dissatisfaction. It may seem like an odd prayer, but we need to pray that this dissatisfaction will grow from a trickle to a torrent so that many will seek after the Living Water revealed by the Gospel of truth.
