# Why does it matter?

When we think about safeguarding in the church what do we mean, why does it matter and whose responsibility is it? We may think it is just a set of rules to follow, DBS checks and endless paperwork, although for some, the failings of the Church of England to protect those it is called to serve, may come to mind. Safeguarding matters, because it matters to God. The Bible urges us to stand up for the vulnerable as God has particular concern for the widow, the orphan, the stranger, those who are marginalised and often powerless. Proverbs 31:8 says, 'we should speak up for people who cannot speak for themselves and protect the rights of the vulnerable'. The needs of the vulnerable were at the heart of Jesus' ministry and they should be at the heart of ours.

Safeguarding in simple terms means, 'to protect from harm,' to promote the welfare of children, young people and vulnerable adults and all those who walk through our doors. It encompasses a range of activities from preventative measures to responding to situations of abuse or neglect. In recent years the Church of England has introduced various policies and procedures to promote a safer environment for all. As part of a loving and caring community, here at St John's and Emmanuel, we are committed to safeguarding as an integral part of our ministry and mission.

As part of my role as safeguarding officer, I'm involved in overseeing safeguarding training and the recruitment of volunteers as well as keeping upto-date with safeguarding matters in general. I liaise closely with the clergy and speak to the Diocesan safeguarding team when necessary. I also report to the PCC on safeguarding at every PCC meeting.

There are many aspects to safeguarding. It is not necessarily concern about a child who may be at risk although this is certainly a matter that should be reported to me or a member of the clergy. Sometimes it can be a case of providing advice to someone about a particular situation or a concern raised about someone who is older or not looking after themselves properly. Similarly, an individual may have experienced abuse or struggling with mental health or addiction issues and unsure where to find appropriate help and support. Earlier this year the PCC met to consider how to best promote a healthy, safe church culture. The main outcome of the discussion was for greater awareness of safeguarding in the church. Whilst I, the clergy, and the PCC have ultimate responsibility for safeguarding, it is something we all play a part in to promote a culture of safety and the welfare of every individual.
